#### Report of the Sr. Pastor

However, as the sun came up I was impressed with the mountains and rugged hills. I remember thinking what a beautiful city. In June, we began a series of interviews which eventually led to a protracted time of candidating and a call to be the next lead pastor here at AIC. # AGM Report 2019 Rev. Stanley Tyson, Discipleship Pastor

# *"There is no one like you, LORD, and there is no God but you, as we have heard with our own ears."* 1 Chronicles 17:20 (NIV)

Throughout the Bible, there are many times of transition. Moses to Joshua, Elijah to Elisha, and from king to king throughout Israel's history are but a few of these. In the midst of changes, David experienced the presence of God in dynamic ways and found that *there is no one like you, Lord*. I feel as though I have walked a similar path over the past year and I also come to the same conclusion. During the first portion of this reporting year, AIC was seeking for man who would be the next lead pastor. As we conclude the reporting year, we know that Rev. Joel Arndt is that man. This transition has shaped much of my service during this time.

Coordinating the Sunday morning worship service and preaching about twice a month was my primary focus. Sixteen guest speakers shared the preaching schedule. The series on the life and ministry of Jesus wove a common thread through the Sunday services. It was truly a team effort as the many members of the worship team, tech team, staff and others served the Lord so that all of us could worship the Lord on Sunday mornings. Together AIC has *heard with our own ears* and seen with our own eyes the strong hand of God during this time.

Many have stepped up to lead and serve, thus providing me time to focus on the needs as interim pastor. Thanks to the children's leaders for covering the many aspects in their area with the loss of our Children's director and my attention focused elsewhere. Thanks to Ofelia Rigonan and the AFF leaders for upholding this area of ministry. Thanks to the community group leaders for continuing this important ministry of nurture and support to so many in our congregation. Appreciation is extended to those who taught the Sunday morning Discipleship classes. I am delighted to see the Parent Connect group launched and under the capable leadership of Jimmy and Louise. Sixty-five certificates were awarded for perfect attendance and completion of a course in either "Connecting with God" or "Discipleship Essentials". My wife taught most of these classes. Special thanks goes to Mary Ann for her unending encouragement, support and standing in the gap during this time.

Children's ministry became a renewed emphasis as we entered 2019. I have been able to meet more regularly with Anita, Erida, Linda and Twinky who comprise the leadership team. We are working on a handbook that will compile our policies and procedures. We plan to complete this handbook soon for approval by the church leadership and then institute the guidelines for the start of the new school year in September. In January, we began monthly training meetings that have experience good attendance. Children's ministry volunteers, parents and the whole of AIC are asked to support these efforts to become more effective at helping children come to know, love and obey God.

Through this year of changes, I can confidently echo the words; there is no God but you.

#### Youth Ministry

I am grateful to our Lord for the past five years of serving in youth ministry at AIC. I have learned a lot and experienced so many amazing opportunities. I want to share a little about the past year and what we are praying God will do in the coming year. I want to thank the volunteers in the youth ministry. Brian Lowther has been a steady rock for the youth ministry over the years and even more so in this past year. I am so blessed and grateful to have a strong brother in Christ who ministers to our youth. Victor Kam and Annie Pau bring much joy to our youth at AIC. They bring an energy and a love that is so encouraging. Annie Payne stepped out in faith this year to help with Impact. She has a servant's heart and has been faithfully joining our group and getting to know the youth. I am excited to see how God will bless the youth through her. Please keep our volunteers and leaders in your prayers.

We have moved Reload back to AIC full time. The youth are stepping out in faith and starting an AIC youth worship team. We are focusing on the theme of worship and prayer in the coming weeks. I am excited to see how God is going to work through the lives of these students. Please pray for them! I am still praying for and in great need of volunteers for our youth fellowship on Friday evenings (Reload). These youth are amazing, and many of them are desiring to know more of God and to serve Him. But they need more leaders and volunteers to help disciple and mentor them. If you are interested, or if you know anyone that is willing, please contact Doug Wallace.

In Impact this year, we continue to have two classes. The Impact Junior class is going through "The Bible Project" video series for the third year. After nearly two years in the Old Testament, they are going through the New Testament. Each week they are learning about a specific book and how it connects to the main story of the Bible. In the Impact Senior class, we are reading through John chapters 14 through 17. The youth are learning how to journal through the Bible, write down questions, highlight passages and spend time in devotions. Also, we spend time having fun together, eating food, and occasionally playing games to help them relax and build some community.

In January, we went on a mission trip to the Philippines alongside GiD. We visited our family church in Quezon City called Community of Christ (COC). Our AIC youth stepped up to take roles as worship leaders, game leaders, discussion leaders, and so many other wonderful things. We saw God working in us, through us, and all around us during the trip. We experienced much joy, peace, and love during the trip. My prayer is that we will be able to continue to take trips to the Philippines in the coming years as we continue to build relationships and serve our Lord Jesus with COC.

In the coming year, we are praying for many youths to surrender their hearts to Jesus as Lord and Savior. We are praying for many ways to allow the youth to take up responsibilities (worship leader, ushers, etc.) that will give them the peace and joy of having a purpose in life. We will continue to look for ways for the youth to live out their faith in serving beyond the walls of AIC. This past week we took a group of youth to serve the homeless in Yau Ma Tei. In December, some youth collected food that would go to the needy in Hong Kong. We continue to serve Saturdays at Inner City Ministries that ministers to the marginalized of Hong Kong society. And we will pray about another opportunity to take the youth on a mission trip to the Philippines.

God is sovereign, and He is faithful. We will trust in Him alone. He deserves all the honor and glory. Please keep the youth and leaders in your prayers!

#### Children's Ministry

This is a special year for AIC children's ministry. Our Lord led us back to our foundation, teaching us to lean only on Him.

In this past year, many things have changed, it was not easy to say goodbye to a few families. The Lord also brought a few new families to AIC and that added a new dynamic and energy to the ministry. We are amazed by how our God moves people around and guides them through different stage of life.

One of the families we said goodbye to was our children's ministry director, Melissa Rose. Now are led by a ministry team: Anita Ko, Linda Yu, Erida Yan and Twinky Chu with Pastor Stan guiding us closely. We meet monthly to pray, to plan and to serve in different areas of ministry.

Every Sunday at 9:30AM to 10:30AM, we are providing musical discipleship classes for age 0-5 in room 107 and spiritual gifting discovery class for age 6-11 in room 407. 10:50AM to 12:15 is our Children's church for age 6-11. We also have nursery (age 0-2) and a class for age 3-5.

Thanks to pastors Stan for helping to rebuild our foundation. In September, we changed our curriculum; we are now using Discipleland. It is a Bible centric curriculum, which focuses on small group discussions for kids to dig deeper in our Lord's Word. Through learning His Word, kids' hearts and behaviour change.

Pastor Stan carefully planned a series of training classes for all our volunteers so that all volunteers are qualified to teach or assist. He started teaching on January 2019. Many volunteers have found these trainings were very valuable for them.

We also had quite a few activities to build up our kid's relationship. During the past summer, we went to indoor rock climbing, watched a movie, swimming at the beach in discovery Bay, clam digging in Lantau Island and bowling. At Christmas, we had a children's Christmas banquet, and we had two families visited our church. We were happy to have our kids carolling around the neighbourhood and giving out bookmarks with the good news message in it.

## **AWANA Clubs**

This year marked the 21<sup>st</sup> year of AWANA ministry in AIC. We meet every Saturday afternoon at Whampoa Alliance Primary School from 2 to 4 pm, with a summer break from June to August. AWANA stands for "Approved workmen are not ashamed", which comes from the verse 2 Timothy 2:15. The ministry goal of Awana is to help young children understand the Gospel and the love of Jesus Christ and to help them apply biblical principles in daily life. We have about 50 enrolled clubbers and 20 adult leaders and helpers.

We offer fun activities, friendship and Bible-based teaching to children from preschool age to preteen years. Children enjoy energetic group activities, songs, games, testimonies, Bible stories and Handbook time. Eye-catching handbooks following Awana curriculum are used for the Scripture memorization drills. Our Awana program provides a supportive environment to young church goers to learn and grow along with peers and adults who share the Christian faith. Unchurched children can learn about the Christian faith gradually in small group settings. Parents are encouraged to walk alongside with their kids and from time to time they are also invited to join our team. At least four parents have joined our team this year. Praise to the LORD!

Special events for this year include the Missionary Month, Hush-Hush Day, Easter Celebrations, Christmas Celebrations, Awana Store and Family Fun Day. On Oct 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018, we went to the Hong Kong Velodrome Park for Awana Outing. Our clubbers and parents had a great time playing remote controlled cars and boats. We also supported Awana HK's walkathon on the same day. Throughout the year, pastors, missionaries are also invited to give message to the clubbers in these events.

This year we had to cancel two meetings due to Typhoon and the outbreak of flu. May the LORD protect us and anoint our team with His power and passion!

It is rewarding to see young children find their identity in our LORD Jesus and learn to serve Him!

# Mission Ministry Team (MMT)

AIC continues to work together with our partners to fulfill the mandate the Lord gave us before He went back to heaven. We know that we serve a missional God. Mission is not only the middle name of Christian & Missionary Alliance but at the center of our faith.

We are to go. In 2018-19, AIC sent individuals or teams on over a dozen trips out of Hong Kong on short and long-term visits. Some of these were regular visits and others were breaking new grounds.

We are to make disciples. In 2018 - 29, our in-house discipleship efforts, reaching out to our communities as well as beyond HK have trained many brothers and sisters in God's word and to share that word with others. We are seeing those we disciple being disciple-makers themselves. Not only are we training those who already know Christ but we are also making new disciples by inviting others to know the Lord of the gospel. A tradition at AIC is to light a candle during the Sunday morning worship service whenever someone came to Christ through an AIC ministry effort. Throughout 2018 - 19, that candle was lit an average of 2 - 3 times a month. While this is not strictly not a part of our mission effort only, but discipleship is an integral part of our mission emphasis.

We are to baptize. By the end of 2018, we baptized 7 brothers and sisters at AIC. Three of them are brothers and sisters from out of Hong Kong but were discipled through AIC's outreaches.

We are to rely on the power from the Holy Spirit and to give all glory to God the Father, His Son Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. Please find below the summary of some of the ministries God led us to this year.

- Continue to partner with CAIS' GID team to assist in discipleship at the school and for cross-cultural ministries. Our youth director, Doug Wallace, led a team from AIC, joining with a team of GID students and teachers from CAIS on a trip to the Philippines over the New Year Vacation. They ministered to the youth and adults of our partner church there. It not only impacted the lives of those they worked with but God was able to touch the lives of our team members deeply as well.
- In February and May of 2018, a few men from AIC conducted two 3-day workshops with the "The World Needs a Father" program for around 20 men each time in a nearby country.
- We had the privilege of having the Samoutou family with us this year. They were and will continue to serve faithfully in Congo. Henri, Joyce, and Ezra shared with us on November 4, as we kick off our Mission Emphasis Month, about the ongoing development of the eye-hospital and their vision and plans to serve. Even though they have left us and are on their

way back to Congo via a stop in England, we will continue to support them in prayer and in other ways.

- A member of our Mission Ministry Team visited a church in Taguig, the Philippines in March, 2018 after the pastor reached out to us for a possible partnership. The church serves the low-income families in a slum area outside Manila. From the visit, we started a partnership with that church. Not only do we support them financially but are planning to have an AIC team visit them on a semi-regular basis to assist in teaching and discipling the congregation. The Taguig Community of Christ Alliance Church just recently celebrated their one year anniversary. They now have a church building, while small, was constructed by the brothers and sisters of the church. Currently, they have 19 baptized members, 8 candidates for baptism, and 10 church goers and 20+ children. That is roughly twice as many as when they first started.
- A couple from the MMT visited the Philippines in September, 2018 to encourage, deepen our relationships and set up plans for future outreaches with 2 of the 3 churches we partner with in that country.
- A large team of AIC families went to the Philippines over the 2018 Easter break to serve at one of the partner churches. They conducted youth gatherings, Children's program, and various outreaches in conjunction with our Filipino brothers and sisters.
- A member of our MMT travels regularly to a nearby Asian country to teach, disciple, conduct premarital and marriage counseling sessions and minister to the brothers and sisters.
- We recently started to support Pastor JoJo of AGS as she serves in Cambodia.
- We continue our partnerships with a number of local ministries such as Inner City Ministries, Hong Kong Christian Kun Sun Association, and The Urban Peacemakers.
- We partnered with the KTAC at CAIS in offering an English Alpha course alongside the Chinese Alpha offered by them.
- We continue our partnership with the Alliance Global Serve (AGS), the mission arm of the Chinese Christian and Missionary Alliance. A number of our congregation serves closely with the AGS.
- We also continue to partner with a number of brothers and sisters who serve in regional countries where the gospel of Jesus Christ is not as readily available. We pray for, support financially and with personnel as appropriate.
- Our partnership with the Fountain Head ministries continues as a member of AIC, Sister Li is again serving with them in a regional country.

- We continue with our partnership with Andy Cheely through the Campus Outreach International as he teaches, trains and prepares those who plan to go overseas to serve.
- Started in the fall of 2018, once a month during the Sunday service, the MMT invites a
  member of the team or one of our mission partners to share about one of our mission
  ministries. The goal of this Mission Moment is to impart information for the congregation as
  well as to encourage active involvement from our congregation. We wanted to encourage our
  brothers and sisters at AIC to see missions, not as a spectator sport but one that is full
  contact. We would like to invite anyone from AIC to join us for the once a month mission
  prayer meetings and to chat with us if you would like to learn more about missions.

May God be honored in how we served.
