2024 Annual General Meeting Minutes

April 14, 2024

Chairman: Rev. Henry Mui - Lead Pastor

1. There being a quorum the meeting was called to order at 13:05 hr.

2. Rev. Henry opened the meeting in prayer.

Rev. Henry hi-lighted that our AGMs are held not just as a regulatory meeting but as an opportunity to give thanks for God's provisions and guidance, and for His love and grace. The annual report link is available from our AIC website for all to read.

3. CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES OF APRIL 2, 2023 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

There being no requests for amendments, a motion to adopt the minutes was moved by Lala Yap; seconded by Jed Daproza, and ALL in favour.

4. TO RECEIVE THE MINISTRY REPORTS AS PUBLISHED AND PRESENTED

4.1 Rev. Henry Mui's verbal report

Last July, we celebrated and received Rev. Henry as our Lead Pastor and he is wholeheartedly grateful for the deepening love and care that continues to multiply in the church, by God's grace.

Our March church retreat was a catalyst for us to grow a deeper prayer life. The return of various ministries such as Tea & Coffee, In-person prayer meets, Adult Discipleship Classes, Community Groups, Care Ministries, Missions, Worship Team and others have truly been a blessing. An informal survey shows that 80% of AIC attendees are actively engaged in acts of service. We praise the Lord!

Rev. Henry encouraged the congregation to read through the ministry reports and to do so with a heart of gratitude in seeing what God is doing in and through AIC Ltd.

5. FINANCIAL REPORT: *Adoption of Auditors Report for 2022-2023

(*audit not available yet)

5.1 Consideration and adoption of the Budget for the 2024-2025 ministry year.

Alan Wong reported that despite Inflation affecting our economy, we managed to keep our costs down. Church attendance has improved with more families joining and church offering has seen a steady increase. Budgeted expenses for 2024/2025 against 2023/2024 saw a decrease of 3.31%.

Overall, we are in a healthy financial position and are in the process of hiring a Discipleship Pastor and a Children's Ministry Director.

Concern was raised about a significant increase in the General Expenses (AV, Ministry Work). It was explained by Ps Luther that there are new equipment to be purchased and/or replaced, and retreat expenses for our worship team which now comprises 25 members.

Motion to adopt the budget was moved by Matthew Chung; seconded by Eric Wan and ALL in favour.

6. AUDITOR: APPOINTMENT OF THE AUDITOR by KTC

Philip Poon & Partners CPA Limited will continue to be our auditor for this year. As the audit report was not available yet an Extraordinary General Meeting will be called at a later date to present the 22/23 audited report.

Motion was moved by Mark Taylor; seconded by Brian Lowther, and ALL in favour.

It has been an incredible year since our last AGM. God is so faithful! It has been a year of learning and growing and welcoming new friends as well as enjoying reunions with old friends as more and more travels have resumed. With another year here in Lai Chi Kok, we are learning and exploring more ministry opportunities in the school and also the surrounding areas. May the Lord continue to lead and guide us to be the Salt and Light in this area. May we carry with us the Aroma of Christ!

In our Sunday Sermons...

Following the heels of last year's **ONE2024 Lent series "Jesus the Messiah"** We took a look at **Prayers of Elijah** - where we looked at the prayers of Elijah in those dramatic and pivotal moments in Israel's journey. Over the Summer (and starting early) we took an unhurried look at The Disciples' Prayer as taught by our Master Jesus. Aside from enjoying the perspective of guest speakers, this was a wonderful time of slowly working our way through this model prayer. Following the summer series, we embarked on **The Rule of Life** - using the Book of James to form and inform our own Rule of Life.

In Oct 2024, we held our first **Wellness**, **Wholeness and Holiness** Month where we took a deeper look at emotional and mental wellbeing from a biblical perspective. This was a very well-received series as we showcased several Christian Counselors and Therapists who shared with us their experience by personally and on a case-basis how to integrate faith and practice in this very relevant aspect of life.

Nov - Jan saw our annual **Missions** Month, **Advent**, and **January Prayer and Fasting** months as we were blessed through these rhythms of our Church calendar. With our current Church wide focus on The Love of God, we took February to look the 4 Greek words for Love - Agape, Eros, Philos, and Storge to explore how these virtues point us to God's great love for us.

As March 2025 rolled around, we once again participated in the ONE2025 Lent Campaign "Jesus the Way Maker, the Miracle Worker" taking a break for our Church Retreat held on 4-6 April where our guest speaker Chris O'Dell, C&MA Missionary and ENVISION Worker based in Taipei spoke on the **Growing in our Discipleship through experiencing the Love of God** and took us through Ephesians 4:15-16:

Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

This retreat marks only our 2nd church retreat since coming out of the pandemic and continues to be a blessing for us to build up community life and welcome in newer members who have joined our church family since our move to Lai Chi Kok.

Our church staff has also experienced changes and growth as we welcome Pastor Joshua Chou as an Associate Pastor and also saw Doug Wallace shift over to CAIS after serving as AIC's youth director for the last 11 years. We thank Doug for his faithfulness and passion to serve the young people of Hong Kong. Doug, Tracy and Joriana will continue to be an active part of the AIC family as this is their home church and this lateral move to CAIS will enable AIC and CAIS to have an even better partnership.

In addition to Pastor Joshua, the Lord has given us another Pastor that will be joining us in July and as of this ministry report, we are in the process of outlining the various ministry responsibilities among the new ministry staff. We would like to give thanks and praise to God our Father for His most perfect timing and provision to AIC. May we continue to grow in God's blessing so that we may continue to bless others!

Our prayer ministries have recently grown under the guidance of GC member, Fidelis Ogwu and we are moving towards having weekly in-person prayer meetings throughout the city. Praise the Lord for growing our passion and desire to pray together. Indeed with 2 or more gathered in His name, He is in our midst!

On the whole, AIC has been growing in numbers and also in spiritual maturity. In the year, we have had the blessed opportunity to host 3 baptism services totalling 19 people. Praise the Lord! We have also welcomed new babies and new families while also having to say goodbye (but really it is "see you again!" because there are no good-bye's in Christ) This is all a part of the joy and tears of what it means to be in community, to be family. 

We were also able to pray for our Short-Term Mission Team to Cambodia.


Our Christmas Eve service was also well attended in spite of the fact that many were already out of town.

YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT

In the last year, we have seen God working in and through AIC Youth to lead us forward with a new generation. This new, young group is finding their way together to take ownership of their fellowship. I am really excited to see this group grow in Christ together and to be apart of their journey. Please pray for them as they enter into the wonderful, but difficult teen years through secondary school.

I want to take the opportunity to thank Stephanie Chu. She is a dear sister in Christ, and has been a rock for the youth or the past couple of years. I am so proud of the young woman she has become and cannot wait to see what God will do in and through her life. She is a staple of the AIC family and has been faithful to her Lord Jesus. She will be missed by the children, youth, young adults, and the church as a whole. The youth group will really miss her and her impact on their lives will go on for decades.

During the fall in Impact, we focused on how we can be more like Jesus. We spent a month on prayer, and focused on His teaching on forgiveness, acceptance, love, and living on a mission for God. In the winter and spring, we have focused on how the Ten Commandments are still relevant for our lives. We talked about how we are not saved through following the law, but that we live to honor and love Christ through being obedience to the law. We looked at how the New Testament writers and Jesus Himself taught and lived the Ten Commandments. The hope is that the youth will not only understand they need to live as Jesus commanded, but that we also need Jesus as our Savior because we cannot perfectly follow the law. We all fall short of the glory of God, and yet Jesus loves us so much that He died for our sins. The youth need to understand their need for forgiveness and a Savior and not assume they are just automatically saved because they grew up around the church. Please pray for their hearts as they wrestle with their faith and their personal relationship with Jesus. May they know the love, grace, and hope of Jesus all their days.

Of course, we also want the youth to know that they can have great joy and fellowship as followers of Jesus. We used nearly half of each Sunday focusing on activities, games, fellowship, and food. This is an integral part of the youth developing a sense of belonging and ownership of their church family. Also, we went outside for laser tag, go karts, arcades, nerf guns, ice skating, and lots of food. This is not only important for their relationships, but helps them to invite new friends to join the church. We've had several new students join over the last two years. Recently we had one new girl, who then weeks later invited another new friend.

In CAIS I was able to coach volleyball and three football teams. This year we expanded our Reach student fellowship from five student leaders to eleven, and our membership is close to fifty students now from around thirty. Also, I was able to preach in chapel, teach and help with the CAIS Gospel Camp, and just got back from an overseas trip with thirty students. CHILDREN'S MINISTRY REPORT -

AIC Children's Ministry helps children to Know God, Love God and Obey God.

In 2024 to 2025, thanks to one of our dedicated members who obey God's calling and help our Children's Fellowship time (9:30-10:30) change back to Children's Discipleship classes. Starting last Sept, our senior members teach our age 9-10 kids with solid biblical truth. Our kids loved the lesson, they even asked the teacher how much time he had used to prepare the lesson. In Jan 2025, we started to have the age 3-5's class. After a month of teaching a few bible verses to our little kids, they came back excitedly to recite bible verses to the teachers. The interesting teaching method and the love of the teachers draw our kids interested in His words. At the same time we also started the age 6-8's class. We were learning Fruit of the Spirit, this age group is very hungry for solid bible truth and fun. Thank God for all of these volunteers stepping up discipling our kids. God sees our hearts, as our class content has improved, He sent 4 families to AIC. This encouraged children's ministry to continue to work hard, rely on God and He will take care of the rest.

As of Sept 2024, AIC Children's Ministry is currently using the Gospel Project curriculum for our Children's Church. This year they started teaching the bible from the beginning - Genesis. We will learn the whole bible in 3 years. From last Sept till now we have been learning Creation and Covenant - Genesis, Law and Life - Exodus & Leviticus & Number, Land and Loss - Deuteronomy & Joshua , and Foolishness and Wisdom - Judges. Aside from watching biblical - Christ center bible story videos and bible verse worship songs, our class use many experiential learning method to bring the lesson to life:

- Planting grass and using dry rices and beans to make rain stick to learn about creation
- Build tent inside the classroom to remind kids God told Abram to go to a place and Abram obeyed God
- Teach them how to sign the bible verse Psalm 100:5
- We tied a string to a bucket and pretend drawing water from a well, to reinforce the point God keep His promise to bless Abram: finding Issac a wife Rachel
- Dress up in costume to role play Esau and Jacob
- We also made a cardbox ark of covenant for kids to act out the scene, etc.

There is never a dull moment to draw the focus of the lessons back on Jesus.

We also had our CNY outing. Although it was a very small group, God's plan is the best. Due to this group being so small, kids were able to build a close relationship with each other.

This year I have seen God at work in many areas:

- Young children who were once rowdy, now not only able to calm down, but also able to care for others and calm down others.
- Once who were so shy, don't even dare to say a word, now very willing to put up their hands to answer questions and express opinions.
- Some used to need parents to sit next to them, but now can answer questions without parents there.
- For volunteers, not only many adult volunteers are willing to step up to help, even some of the youth who used to behave like a teen, now becomes very caring, able to handle kids: going to the washroom, encouraging kids to focus,

being flexible and proactively assisting in sudden changing situations. That was an 180 degree change by God.

Thanks to the worship ministry to invite and train our kids to sing for Father's Day and Christmas Cantata again. Moreover, one of the worship leaders who has a very busy schedule is still willing to set up AIC Children's Choir. That is the dream of this leader and mine. Praise the Lord. Children can use their voices to serve the Lord regularly.

God has also opened a few new doors for AIC Children's Ministry to connect with CAIS student and staff families. We have started a Friday after school ECA in CAIS. This ECA is named W.A.L.K. We Are Loving Kids, our theme bible verse (Ephesians 5:1-2). We equip the prep and grade 1 students with different skills, so they can visit the elderly home in Jun. We have been training them: to practice magic, making different crafts with God's messages, teaching students some senior exercise so they can show the elderly, preparing students to play specific games with the elderly and practice singing. Because of the song performance three CAIS families joined our Christmas Cantata performance and Christmas Lunch. One family joined our Sunday service a few times and one family joined Awana regularly.

Thanks to an Awana leader who took her extra time to partner with me hosting craft workshops for AIC and CAIS families. This outreach allowed us to connect with the families and promoted AIC to them. We started from Sept till Mar, once a month. Relationships are slowly building. We will continue to do this as long as God allows.

AIC Children's Ministry also hosted a booth in CAIS Thanksgiving Carnival and CNY Carnival. We were there to promote our church to CAIS. Thank God one grade 6 girl joined our youth group afterward, and she even brought her friend along.

Thank God this year I am able to join a few CAIS parent's whatsapp groups: The once a month badminton night, hiking group, Craft club and community service groups. I organized two times of visitation to the senior home and assisted in 3 different volunteer activities. Through different activities, I get to know more parents to promote AIC.

We will continue to follow our God's leading and guidance, building up AIC kids, reaching out to CAIS students & staff families and the community. We are committed to walk alongside the families. Pray that our Lord will continue to use us, give us wisdom and strength. If you have the burden in your heart to help children know, love and obey God, please come talk to us.

FILIPINO MINISTRY REPORT

"Serving the Filipino community by intentionally showing the love of Christ and actively spreading the Good News for the glory of God" (Serve Show Spread)

In this past year, God has blessed us with various opportunities, ministry partners and organizations to continue fulfill the group's vision of "Serve-Show-Spread", with that we bring Him all the praises, thanksgiving and the glory.

Serve - In partnership with the International Filipino Alliance Ministries (IFAM) HK which comprises of four other Filipino Alliance Churches, we jointly organized the 2nd Chinese New Year Conference "Living Stress Free" with the topics on Livelihood and Obtaining Financial Wisdom, where majority of our ladies participated.

The Community Based Health Ministry has been helpful as more ladies give serious attention to their physical health and get appointment in clinics for further medical check. We thank God for bringing Dr. George and Dr. Emily Tipoe twice this past year for follow up as they provided simple screening of checking blood pressure and blood sugar to detect chronic illnesses.

On two occasions, we had representatives from Philippine Consulate General in HK to visit the group. One representative from Social Security System department gave an introduction for the services it provides as protection to members against life's contingencies. Another two representatives from Overseas Voting Section, conducted a briefing regarding the coming online voting for Philippine National and Local Election in May. Thank God for such arrangement as we provided these practical services to the ladies, as they live and work overseas, and to assist them be good stewards and responsible citizens.

Thanks God for allowing us to be His channel of blessings as we received generous supplies of clothes and toys from Crossroads, assorted bags from a friend, used clothes from our ladies. We were able to send 2 big boxes of clothes/bags/toys to our church plants in Bulacan and Taguig Philippines, and one box to help those who were affected by the typhoon in Bicol. We are also grateful to be recipients of these blessings from Crossroads, most valuable are the free laptops which we distributed to leaders and volunteers in different ministries of AIC, to use to access digital materials shared in their respective ministry.

We had our Leaders' Retreat at Breakthrough Camp last May, discussing the Christ Centered Leadership (resource from Rightnow Media). Taking this time to refresh and recharge as we press on serving the Filipino group in His love, wisdom and strength and following Christ's example. We organized outdoor fellowships during statutory holidays. We had outing at Trio Beach in Sai Kung, Peng Chau Island, Shek O Beach, Christmas Day at Ma Wan and New Year's day at Pastor Luther and Lala's residence in Tai Po.

Throughout the year, we had over 50 visitors, friends and relatives who joined the fellowship / outing and among those, 7 ladies continue to be part of the group, and even started serving in AIC ministries. We pray that those who "come and see" will be followed up well and find AIC a place where they experience the love of God and grow in their faith.

Many of our ladies are joyfully serving in various ministry at AIC, from Tea & Coffee, Guest Services, Praise Team, Dance Team, Choir, Children's Ministry, A/V and Governing Committee.

Show We continue to appreciate, support and encourage each and every one as we celebrate Mother's Day, Father's Day, Single's Day, birthday milestone and the past year the graduation of 4 ladies who completed their online ALLTEE (The Alliance Theological Education by Extension) program. We arranged special tribute for ladies returning home for good. We made extra effort to celebrate Christmas as one big family and invited friends and relatives to join this special gathering and fellowship. These occasions gave us opportunity to show them God's unconditional love.

As we desire to grow deeper in the love and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ and in His words, we rejoice with the 47 ladies who engaged in reading the Bible using the M'Cheyne Daily Reading Plan. We had 13 of them completed the reading of the New Testament and Psalms twice, and through the rest of the Bible once and had taken into their hearts 12 memory verses. One lady finished her 2-7, Growing in God's Family study and is growing in her faith and service to our Lord Jesus Christ.

We had the opportunity to share the Word and study on Evangelism using the 4 Spiritual Laws, learning the character of Jesus following the book "Walking Like Jesus Did", Practical & Authentic Living on the book of James, CAMACOP Mission Month sermon on All for Jesus for All Nations from book of Colossians, Christmas Advent series, C&MA 40 Day of Prayer – The Attributes of the God to Whom We Pray, Refuge – Finding Home in a World of Change, book of Ruth and currently on ONE 2025 Lent – Jesus as Waymaker and Miracle Worker.

Spread - Announcing God's Story – almost without a miss that in every meeting we would hear from ladies how God is at work in and through them as they gladly and victoriously declare God's goodness, His faithfulness, guidance, provision, grace and mercy as they put Him first in their lives and persevere despite life's struggles and challenges

We schedule an outreach and evangelism time every 5th Sunday of the month.

Thank God for the support of Mommy Mary Ann Tyson who I regularly meet online for prayer and guidance as I lead the group, and of course thanks the whole AIC staff team and family for their encouragement and prayers as well as together we serve our great and gracious God.

MISSION MINISTRY TEAM (MMT) REPORT

We praise the Lord for His guidance in the past year for the missions ministry at AIC. The highlight of the year was definitely our first mission trip after Covid. Moreover, we continue to deepen our relationship with our current partners and explore new partnerships.

Our mission trip was to Cambodia from 16 to 22 December. We had two young adults, Stephanie and Faith, with two more experienced adults in missions, Lavina and Matthew Chung, leading. Although we were just a small team of four, we were able to minister to the students as well as mission workers and teachers in Pailin and Phnom Penh. This trip continued a heritage of AIC serving in the country through Alliance Global Serve (AGS), the mission agency of our denomination, which also co-organised this trip with the church. The team was very grateful for the generous financial and prayer support of the whole church.

The congregation now has a much deeper understanding of the needs of AGS' ministries in Cambodia, especially the schools in Pailin. Apart from the post-trip sharing of the team in early January, Pastor Henry brought back observations and needs of the country to the congregation after joining a pastoral trip to Cambodia in November, visiting various ministry fields in the country supported by AGS.

Last year the church continued from the past few years supporting financially Pastor Jojo, the field director of Cambodia. As she left the field because of family needs in the summer, the support was stopped because her MOU with AGS ended. She will continue to serve Cambodia in a different capacity.

In the summer and autumn last year, the church sent some financial and material aid to the Filipino churches we are supporting financially as they were affected by the typhoons and the related flooding. The two churches we are currently supporting monthly through the church's Mission Fund are Community of Christ Alliance Church at Taguig City and Marilao Alliance Church in Bulacan. The ministries of both churches are expanding. The Marilao Church celebrated their 12th founding anniversary last September.

Inner City Ministries (ICM), which the church has been supporting financially and helping with their Vacation Bible School, celebrated their 30th anniversary last October. Doug Wallace, our Youth Director, is the Chairman of the Board of Directors.

Joyce and Henri Samoutou are now serving in Congo. The structure and interior of the hospital in Ouesso have been completed, and they are now fitting it out. The family needs funds for the education of their kids. The church set up an educational fund for missionary kids last November. Donations are welcome.

We held our annual Mission Emphasis Month in November. The theme was **God is Mighty to Save**. We had different speakers giving sermons and sharing during Missions Moment. The details are as follows:
