Advent - The Season of Hope, Faith, Joy & Peace

Dear Friends.

Starting on November 28th and ending with Christmas eve is the Advent season. Advent is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds as we look forward to our Savior's birth. With the coming of the Advent we will be light a new candle each week up until Christmas Eve when we light all five candles. What do these candles

The **first candle**, which is purple, symbolizes **hope**. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

The **second candle**, also purple, represents **faith**. It is called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The **third candle** is pink and symbolizes **joy**. It is called the "Shepherd's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the **final purple candle** to mark the final week of prayer as we wait for the **birth of our Saviour**. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

The **white candle** is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "**Christ Candle**" and represents the life of Christ. The color white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Saviour.

The Alliance Filipino Fellowship has been serving domestic helpers from the Philippines who are undergoing quarantine in designated facilities. The fellowship partners with eight other Filipino churches in Hong Kong, as well as Kabayan Radio Hong Kong, and provides welcome kits to the helpers who are serving their 21-day quarantine in Silka Tsuen Wan Hotel or Penny's Bay Quarantine Centre on Lantau Island. The kit includes masks, hand sanitiser, a SIM card, snacks, a New Testament Bible and devotional material Our Daily Bread. Those helpers are also under follow-up through text messages after they have received those kits.

Since the ministry began in March, AFF was privileged to be part of the HQM team who had helped many incoming Filipino domestic workers. The fellowship prays that connection with those helpers could be continued and they could share with them the love of Christ in person.
