## Group Discussion Questions

### **As a Group Read Acts 10:1-23**

- 1) Cornelius was a good man. How does chapter 10 describe his life?  
What character traits stood out in his life? (see verses 1-2, 22, and 24)
  
- 2) God spoke to both Cornelius and Peter. Does God still speak to us today?  
If so how does God speak to us?
  
- 3) What was the response of Cornelius and Peter when they knew what it was that God wanted them to do. What should our response be when we know that God has spoken to us?
  
- 4) Cornelius is an example of a really good person yet he still needed to believe in Jesus as his savior and receive Jesus. Why is a good life enough for God?
  
- 5) As you end your time please remember to pray for “Joshua” the little boy that pastor Joel mentioned in his closing illustration. He has Davet’s Syndrome. Pray also for his mother and father “Jim and Janie” that they too would receive Jesus as their savior.
