1. How does Baptism give you a picture of Hope?
 The word Ebenezer is a commemoration of divine assistance. It is a physical reminder for you to remember what God has done for you. Share an Ebenezer from your walk with Jesus that anchors your faith and renews your hope in God's love.
 The following are the questions posed to the baptism candidates. Take a moment and consider your response to them and share with the group how it would look to live these commitments out in your daily life.
4 Questions to ask Baptism Candidates:
#1 Do you believe that Jesus is God's anointed King, the one who was promised through the Scriptures?
#2 Do you believe that Jesus died for our sins and rose from the dead?
#3 And are you committed to following Jesus no matter the cost, without conditions or excuses for the rest of your life?
#4 "Is it your desire to turn from sin and know, trust and obey Jesus?"
