Unstoppable Acts 28: The Story Continues

Reminder of the start of the Unstoppable series:	
	We must be filled with and led by the (Luke 24:46-49, Acts 1:8, 2:4, 2:38-39) It is possible to accomplish much without the power of the Holy Spirit. But there will not be much eternal value.
1)	Acts 28 may be the last chapter of the book, but it is not the end. The s!
	"For two whole years Paul stayed there in his own rented house and welcomed all who came to see him. He proclaimed the kingdom of God and taught about the Lord Jesus Christ—with all boldness and without hindrance!" Acts 28:30-31
2)	Paul was under h a for two years with a Roman guard.
	God's Sovereignty - Paul was forced to stay in one place at his own expense. This may seem bad, but it meant two important things: 1) Everyone in Rome knew where to find Paul. 2) It meant that Paul was protected and safe (many people were trying to kill him) for two years to build up the church in Rome and share the gospel with Roman citizens, soldiers and officials. (Acts 28:16)
3)	All roads lead to R The opposite is correct, Rome had roads that led back out to all nations. The story continues!

Unstoppable: Acts 28 Small Group Discussion

- 1) What do you think it means to be filled with the Holy Spirit? What do you think it means to be led by the Holy Spirit?
- 2) Do you feel that you are filled with and led by the Holy Spirit? If so, explain why. If not, consider to have the faith and courage to talk about it and pray together.
- 3) Read Acts 28:16. On the surface, this seems like a bad part of the story. How did God redeem this time in Paul's life?
- 4) Why do you think the book of Acts ended the way it did in Acts 28:30-31?
- 5) If God told you that one day He was going to send a messenger to record your life down as chapter 29 of the book of Acts, how would people see God working in your life? If you knew someone was going to record how you lived your life, would that change how you lived today? Would it change your plans?

Read Romans 14:12, 2 Corinthians 5:6-11 together.

God's Bible is finished, but the story continues through us, the church. What will your story be when you face God? All of us will face God one day and give an account for what we do with our lives. This should cause us to experience the fear of the Lord, but we also must rest in the grace of God and know His love for us. We will not face judgment or wrath for our sins, but we will give an account. Pray and ask God if there is anything He would have you change. Then, let us encourage one another as we join in God's continuing story, the greatest story ever told!
