### **Love manifested through the church**

Start by sharing a story or testimony of how you have personally experienced the love of God in a powerful way.



Then spend time in prayer with grateful hearts for who God is and all He has done in your lives.

### **Read John 15:12-17 together.**

- 1) We have so many different ideas on what love is. However, in this context, Jesus is commanding His followers to love each other. So, this is not the same as romantic love or biological familial love.
- 2) Discuss what you believe/understand Jesus is saying by commanding us to love each other. In other words, what does that look like in our lives?
- 3) Verse 13 reminds us how Jesus actively showed His love for the church. How have you actively showed your love for God's church? (Although this is referring to all Christians, share specifically how you have shown love to brothers and sisters at AIC).
- 4) Share how you feel you have received love from other brothers and sisters at AIC.
- 5) Finally, in what way can each one of you, personally show active love for others at AIC? And how can we grow as a church in showing love to one another?



Pray for ways each one of you (individually), as well as for your group, and then pray for how AIC as a whole can grow exponentially in love for one another in the coming years.
