Sermon Points:

1. Introductory Question: "What makes patience challenging?"

- People... Sinful People
- Patience & Forbearance = *makrothumeo* = "be longsuffering"
- Takeaway: Bear with others as God bears with you

2. Matthew 18

- Context: Jesus' Identity and Teaching
- V.21-22 Peter
 - Peter thinks gracious
 - o Jesus teaches authoritatively
 - Genesis 4:24 Revenge to Forbearnace
- V.24 Debt #1
 - o 200,000 years of daily wages
 - o Impossible to Pay
- V.27 King
 - Not only delays (forbears) but cancels
 - Ultimate Fulfillment: Jesus (1Peter 2:24)
- V.28 Debt #2
 - 100 days of daily wages
 - Miniscule in comparison, but not on its own
 - V.33 "Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?"
 - "They might owe you, but you owed God everything"

3. Luke 18:10-14

- V.13: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner."
- Need patience? Pray "God, thank you for your mercy on me, a sinner."
