Strong when I am Weak "Treasures in Jars of Clay" 2 Corinthians 4:7-12 September 21, 2025

Sermon Points:

1. The Paradox of Power in Weakness

- Jars of Clay (v.7):
 - > Ordinary, fragile, and common—like us.

Designed to show that power comes from God, not ourselves.

- All-Surpassing Power (v.7):
 - ➤ God's power resides in us—the same power that raised Christ from the dead.

2. The Reality of Suffering and Strength (vv.8–9)

- Pressed but Not Crushed:
 - ➤ Life's pressures do not define or destroy us.
- Perplexed but Not in Despair:
 - ➤ Confusion doesn't lead to hopelessness.
- Persecuted but Not Abandoned:
 - > God remains present even in opposition.
- Struck Down but Not Destroyed:
 - Resilience comes from Christ's life within us.

3. The Purpose: Christ's Life Revealed (vv.10–12)

- Carrying the Death of Jesus (v.10):
 - > Our suffering identifies us with Christ's death.
- Revealing the Life of Jesus (v.11):
 - ➤ God's power is most visible in our weakness.
- Life at Work in Others (v.12):
 - ➤ Our trials become testimonies that bring life to others.

4. Living as Clay Jars with Eternal Treasure

- Shift in Perspective:
 - > See difficulties as opportunities for God's power to be displayed.
- Hope Rooted in Resurrection:
 - ➤ Our hope isn't in circumstances but in Christ's victory over death.
- Faith in Action:
 - > Trust God's promises when situations seem hopeless.
